Zarringhalam added they were working on a few more features that will be made public at an appropriate time.

Truecaller can also now be used to authenticate visitors at an office or a housing society with the 'verify with Truecaller' option that will match the number and identity of, say, a person who has come to seek an appointment or meet someone in an office or house. The feature will be rolled out at Gurgaon's Vatika Business Centre for the first time.

"This is super exciting for us as the tie-up will be a great step towards ensuring efficiency in operations without compromising on privacy. This in no way violates privacy of our customers as it seeks a user's permission to give access to his/her information," said Zarringhalam.
